In 2008, she went back to work full time so a replacement was also needed for the website. In the spring of 2011, Sue Lightfoot officially took over the site in a minor capacity as the Web Coordinator with Laura helping in the background as the Webmaster/creator.

By the middle of 2011, Sue Lightfoot and Karen Romberg thought of a way to show SAWGA's appreciation to Laura for all her work with the website. A woman who devoted her time to a club she no longer participated in due to her work schedule though still wanted to help. At the 2012 SAWGA Spring meeting, Sue proposed a motion to the Executive Board and it passed so the Laura Bossart Outstanding Contributor Award was approved.

The award is to recognize outstanding contributions by SAWGA members past or present to the women's golf community. At the 2012 SAWGA award banquet, Miriam Clark became the first recipient with 7 more women through 2019.

She has always been available over the years for any issues that arise with the website even though she is now retired and living in Arizona. When the SAWGA members see a need for change, she is the one who still creates and implements the updates with the thought still in mind to keep it user friendly for all members.
